COUNCIL MINUTES FOR NOVEMBER 3, 2025**

Council Members present were Bruce Hart, Gary Williams, Joan Mensinger, Wayne Mensinger, Jerid Lindenmuth, Bob Decusky, Jewel Tuberty, Pastor Michelle, and Laura Rusinko. Also present were Marion Chupasco and Clarissa Geary. The meeting opened with Wayne Mensinger reading the devotions.

Treasurer reports were reviewed, approved, and filed for audit.

Pastor's Report: Worship services - 3 Sunday Services, Bible Studies 2, Funeral services 2, Meetings: 6 Councils (2) Goals (2) Selling/renting parsonage (1) Helping Hands (1), Meetings with other pastors – 1 North of the Mountain Youth Group met 10/19, attended a viewing. Racial Justice Team 1, Breakfast with Bible, Lunch with pastor, Fellowship meal, Brandonville Union SS Halloween Party, Visits - home, hospital, etc. 16, Church Council goal meeting: Ringtown Identity Statement “We are St John’s Church Ringtown and we are the hub of the community where everyone is welcome in God’s love.” 3 Goals: 1. To connect with and provide hospitality for at least one community group 2. To meet the needs of at least 3 groups of people who may not come to church otherwise. 3. To declutter once a year, so that everyone can find what they need.

Committee Reports:

Helping Hands- 27 people attended fellowship luncheon. The next one November 30th with Christmas theme.

Think Tank- Meeting this Thursday to discuss the blessing tree.

Building Committee- Wayne received revised prints. Discussed sprinkler system. Organ serviced on Oct. 29th. Discussed servicing parsonage furnace. Fire extinguishers checked.

Worship & Music- Starting rehearsals for Christmas.

Sunday School- attendance improving, 6 kids came last Sunday.

Town Social- Jerid got two quotes for the tickets.

Old Business:

The total profit for the Chicken BBQ was around \$2,000. Church council goal meeting went well. We will say the identity/mission statement at the end of every service. The goals are set to be met by December of 2026. Options were discussed about selling and not selling the parsonage. Gary Bob, and Wayne are going to another seminar dealing with cemeteries, parsonages, and other church property issues.

New Business

Elections were discussed. Joint budget meeting with Brandonville, will be Nov. 18th or Nov. 20th at 6:30pm. Discussed updating some church policies and job descriptions. Discussed ways to help those in need who do not qualify for the local Food Pantry. We are going to try and set up a church pantry in the nursery room. A 2-3 person committee will be formed to run it. Pastor Michelle will meet with the committee and discuss how to proceed and ways to distribute to families and individuals in need of food help. Bags will be distributed to congregational members by children who come forward for the children's sermon. A list of requested nonperishable food and personal care items will be announced each week. Joan and Laura will look into some potential donors and help set up the pantry. There may be other sources of food we can look into.

Ideas were discussed to make our area more parent/child friendly. We want the Sunday School to be involved with any discussions. **Identification Statement:** The statement will be displayed in the bulletin and we will say it at the end of every service. **Brandonville Mission Statement:** We are St. John's Brandonville where God accepts you as you are and so do we. **Goals: 1. Project:** Slides to be displayed during the service to make it easier to follow the service. Items needed screen/large print. **2. Hospitality:** By December 2026 everyone coming to our church will feel welcome within the first three minutes of arrival. Previously we had greeters at the front door. We will explore the possibility of motion lights at the corners of the church to illuminate the entrances. We want people to feel comfortable upon arrival to our church. **3. People's Needs:** We need to know and meet the needs of at least 60% of people. We need to try to meet the needs of children. Possibly a prayer ground. A space for children to be. We could have sensory toys available for them. **Articles of Incorporation:** still being worked on. **Altar Ware:** The altar vases were polished and look much better. We will address having the cross and candle holders polished as well.

New Business: Church Council Elections: Potential names were discussed to fill 2 vacancies. **Proposed Budget 2026:** to be prepared for December meeting. We will attend a joint meeting with Ringtown to discuss shared expenses on Tuesday 11/18, 6:30pm. **Policies:** We will need to review/update policies. Licensed Lay Minister (LLM) a job description will be needed.

The Box Tops for Education program is going digital with a new mobile app which will allow parents to scan their store receipt and earn money for their kiddo's school! To earn Box Tops, just purchase products with the new Box Tops label, scan your receipt with the new Box Tops app (for iTunes or Google Play) and earn 10¢ per participating product. After the receipt is scanned, money will automatically be added to your school's earnings online. Note that **your receipts must be scanned within 14 days of purchase** but you can scan 50 receipts per day, per registered account. The mobile app will also allow you to track your contributions as well as your school's running total...at Rngtn for North Schuylkill Elementary and at Brndvl for Valley Elementary.
